























**We are not responsible for packets not picked up on time. There are no refunds on orders of seedlings not picked up.**

<b>1 - <u>White Pine</u>:</b> <i>Pinus strobus</i> (5/ pkt) 5-0 YR (18"-30") Excellent for windbreak and hedges. Prefers acidic, well drained soils. 	<b>2 - <u>Colorado Blue Spruce</u>:</b> <i>Picea pungens</i> (5/pkt) 4-0 yr (8"-16") Used for landscape, windbreaks, reforestation and Christmas trees. Adaptable to variety of soils.
<b>3 – <u>Norway spruce</u>:</b> <i>Picea abies</i> (5/pkt) 3-0 YR (10"-20") Used for ornamentals, timber and wind/snow breaks. Adapts to variety of soil types.	<b>4 – <u>Green Giant Arborvitae</u>:</b> <i>Thuja plicata x standishii</i> ; (5/pkt) 2-1 YR, (8"-16"); Fast growing, pyramidal shape. Height of 50-75 ft, width of 10-20 ft. Dense foliage, fern-like texture that has shown resistance to deer.
<b>5 –<u>White Cedar</u>:</b> <i>Thuja occidentalis</i> L. , (5/pkt) 2-0 YR, (12"-15"). This arborvitae is one that deer like to browse, but it also likes a bit of a wetter condition. It cannot tolerate extreme wet or dry. Medium growth rate, 1-2 ft in full sun and moist soil.	<b>6 – <u>Bald Cypress</u>:</b> <i>Taxodium distichum</i> (5/ pkt), 2-0 yr (15"-30"); Slow growing deciduous conifer that loves wet soil. Great for wildlife
<b>7 – <u>Red Oak</u>:</b> <i>Quercus rubra</i> , (5/pkt) 2 YR, 8-16"; fast growing, sun loving, urban tolerant. Consistently great timber value.  	<b>8 – <u>White Oak</u>:</b> <i>Quercus alba</i> (5/pkt) 3 yr (12"-24") Slow growing, Loves full sun and moist soil.  
<b>9 – <u>Swamp White Oak</u>:</b> <i>Quercus bicolor</i> (5/pkt.) 2 yr (10"-18") Great native for our wet soils.  	<b>10 – <u>Sugar Maple</u>:</b> <i>Acer saccharum</i> (5/pkt) 2-0 yr (12"-18")   Adaptable to different soils, important for wildlife and pollinators
<b>11 – <u>Common Paw Paw</u>:</b> <i>Asimina triloba</i> (5/pkt) 2-0 yr (6"-12") Slow growth, can take a little bit wetter soil. Edible fruit, wildlife, and pollinator use.  	<b>12 – <u>Common Pear</u>:</b> <i>Pyrus communis</i> (5/pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") Loves full sun and rich, well-drained soil. Favored by pollinators and produces edible fruit. 
<b>13 – <u>Washington Hawthorn</u>:</b> <i>Crataegus phaenopyrum</i> (5/pkt) 4 yr (10"-20") Understory tree that pollinators love. Great for a hedge, does have large thorns.  	<b>14 – <u>American Persimmon</u>:</b> <i>Diospyros virginiana</i> (5/pkt) 3 yr (12"-24") Great for pollinators, great fruit for eating. Grows to 40' high, 20-35' wide. Loves sandy soils, but will tolerate poor soil. 
<b>15 - <u>American Plum</u></b> <i>Prunus americana</i> (5/ pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") 20 ft max height, fast grower. Edible fruit *pits are poisonous*. Heat and drought tolerant.  	<b>16 – <u>Allegheny Serviceberry</u>:</b> <i>Amelanchier laevis</i> (5/ pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") Small tree with height of 25 ft. Loves part-sun/shade and moist soil. Multi-trunked, irregular shape.  
<b>17 – <u>Buttonbush</u>:</b> <i>Cephalanthus occidentals</i> (5/pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") Does great in wet areas, grows up to 12 ft tall, 8 ft wide. Loved by pollinators, great for a wet hedgerow.  	<b>18 - <u>Nannyberry</u>:</b> <i>Viburnum lentago</i> (5/pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") Pollinator shrub, 16 ft tall and 12 ft wide, full sun to part shade. Will sucker from roots to create thicket. Edible fruit.  
<b>19 – <u>Red Currant</u>:</b> <i>Ribes rubrum</i> (5/pkt) 1-0 yr (12"-18") Great for edible landscape. NOTE -Alternate host for white pine blister rust, deadly to white pines. Limited quantity.  	<b>20 – <u>Red Buckeye</u>:</b> <i>Aesculus pavia</i> (5/pkt) 2-0 yr (6"-12") Fits in our hardiness zone, but traditionally found more south, this small tree (15-20' tall) is beloved by hummingbirds and butterflies 
<b>21 – <u>Ohio Buckeye</u>:</b> <i>Aesculus glabra</i> (1/pkt) 2-0 yr (18"-24") celebrate the semiquincentennial with Ohio pride by planting our state tree. Also beloved by pollinators.  	<b>22 - 55 gal plastic rain barrel with diverter kit, standard 2"x3" downspout size</b>
